

Coyote Crossing, Conshohocken Pa. By Sundance Design



This exciting project is one of my favorite Equinox. It started because the restaurant owner had a beautiful outdoor patio with many trees and plants. He wanted to preserve trees and the look and feel of the space, and give a more controlled and predictable environment, when the summer sun would blaze. The umbrellas he was using were inadequate. He also wanted to be able to guarantee using the space in the rain. The property was angled and the pergola needed to be as well. We helped guide the project through zoning and permitting. The pergola is approximately 30' x 28'.



I first did a 3-model, not only to show the client the visuals, but to work out details:

- Height to avoid glass wall.
- Angled bay to fit within set back.
- To communicate with surveyor for zoning permit

The 3-D proved invaluable, even at Zoning meeting



The client chose bronze frame and tan louvers. He considered that organic. The louvers remain open most of the time to allow light for his trees, that he treasures.

I used 7x7 posts because of the height.
